
To all those instructors who passed their revalidation test in October.

<u>GET READY TO SKI</u>

You've been training hard for your ski trip (or is that wishful thinking) but one of the main contributors to injury in the recreational skier is the absence of a warm up routine.


Some form of warm up should be done before making a single turn. Look at the walk to the ski lift as an opportunity to warm the body. Warming the body helps to prevent injuries that may be caused by going too hard, too fast, too soon with cold, muscles and joints. You should warm up slowly and increase the intensity and complexity.

Leg and arm swings get the body going but don't forget to do some stretches.


IT IS ENTIRELY DEPENDENT ON CONTRIBUTIONS TO KEEP THE OFFICE RUNNING
